ANNOUNCING THE DEATH OF OUR MEMBER AND DEAR FRIEND, JUDY THOMSON, 1940 - 2022

President Anne Seymour sent the following announcement to our members, November 1, 2022:



It is with deep sadness that I announce to you the passing today, November 1, 2022, of **Judy Thomson** in her 82nd year with her family by her side.

Judy's husband, Ken Thomson, predeceased her earlier this year. Judy was a long-time member of CFUW Owen Sound and Area Club and was named a Notable Woman of the Year in 2019 during the National CFUW Club's hundred-year anniversary celebrations.

Judy was a champion of the Arts in the community and a long-time volunteer with the Tom Thomson Art Gallery. She was instrumental in the founding of the Canada Centre of the Arts at Owen Sound and the Sweetwater Music Festival. She was recognized as a citizen of the Year by the Owen Sound City Council and she also received the Citizen's Contribution to the Arts Award from the Grey Bruce Arts Council

Judy was a Professor at Georgian College for over 19 years and in her final year was awarded the title of Professor Emeritus. With the Bluewater Association of Lifelong Learning (BALL), Judy delivered many lecture series. She also served on the Grey Bruce Regional Hospital Board.

A memorial service for Judy will be held on Saturday, November 12, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. at the Brian E Wood Funeral Home.

A memorial donation will be made to the Tom Thomson Art Gallery on behalf of the CFUW Owen Sound and Area Club as requested.

Executive Meeting Highlights - November 1, 2022

Good news! President Anne Seymour was delighted to inform the Executive that the Club has finally received the outstanding balance of the Graduate Women International fee rebate from CFUW National. The positive outcome comes after considerable time and effort spent on the part of former Executive members Trisha Hendrie and Roberta Cuthbertson, as well as Anne Seymour more recently.

Based on the reports from Treasurer Styn Furness, Education Fund Coordinator Kathy Needham, and Membership Coordinator Anne Dondertman, it's clear the Club is in good financial shape, certainly the strongest since the arrival of COVID. Our membership is growing, our members have been generous in their donations to the Education Fund, and the Ted Barris lecture was a great success, both in terms of audience turnout and providing a profit. Given the sound financial position, the Executive approved allocating \$4,000 to scholarships and \$1,500 to Scientists in School for the 2022-2023 school year.

Largely due to increased reliance on electronic communications during the pandemic, tasks related to sustaining the Club's social media vehicles and reliance on Zoom are considerable. The Executive is working diligently to recruit new members to meet the social media and technical needs of the Club.

As you will note from the committee and interest group reports, Club members have lots of engaging activities to look forward to in the weeks and months ahead.

EDUCATION REPORT

I am so pleased to report that our new and returning members have donated over \$4,200 this year towards the Education Fund. This is proof of our chapter's strong commitment to improving the lives of women and girls in our region. Added to this is \$2,283 received from our fund with the Community Foundation Grey Bruce.

On Tuesday, the Executive recommended the following distribution from the Scholarship Fund:

- 1) \$4000 in scholarships (\$1,000 each to: Owen Sound District SS, Peninsula Shores, St. Mary's, and Georgian College)
- 2) \$1500 to Scientists in School. This will fund 5 classes in our area.

The charitable receipts are ready!

Thanks to Styn Furness and Anne Dondertman, the donated funds have been transferred into the Scholarship Fund and I have everyone's current address.

I will be bringing receipts with me to our general meeting at the Roxy on November 8th. If you attend this meeting and have donated, please come up and say hi. If you don't know me – ask any member of the Executive Committee to point me out. I will mail the remaining receipts to those unable to attend the meeting.

Born in Germany during the war, I grew up in small town Ontario. To the dismay of my parents, I was born an artist, and all the education I received since has not deflected me from this. I have been a full-time artist for the past 25 years. I have exhibited in more than 50 solo and group exhibitions (Canada, USA, Barbados, Germany), most recently in "Colours of the Caribbean" at ArtSplash Gallery 2022. My paintings have won a number of awards and can be found in private collections all over the world. I have led a peripatetic life. The constant in my life has been Barbados where my family has lived on and off for almost 40 years. The people of Barbados, particularly the children and women, continue to inspire my work. My husband and I first fell in love with the Grey County area when we lived in Inglis Falls from 2000 to 2012. In 2021 we happily returned to live in Owen Sound.

Patricia Hiemstra A retired arts administrator and educator of long experience, Patricia strongly believes in giving back to the community as a volunteer. She was an active board director for non-profit organizations in Ottawa and Toronto before moving to Owen Sound in 2016. Leisure activities include playing piano and viola da gamba, fabric and mixed media art, quilting, swimming and cycling.



Katherine Lochnan has had a farm at Balaclava since 1986 which is her earthly paradise. She and her husband, John



Swallow, a retired acoustical engineer, divide their time between Toronto and Balaclava. An art historian with a Ph.D. from the Courtauld Institute, University of London, Katharine is senior curator emeritus at the Art Gallery of Ontario, a senior fellow of Massey College and a sessional lecturer at the University of Toronto. She has produced major international exhibitions and publications focusing on artistic visionaries including "The Earthly Paradise: The Arts and Crafts of William Morris in Canadian Collections", "Holman Hunt: The Visionary Pre-Raphaelite", "Turner, Whistler, Monet: Impressionist Visions" and "Mystical Landscapes from Vincent van Gogh to Emily Carr." She was the consultant to the Toronto School of Theology in developing a new stream within the Master of Theological Studies degree in Theology, Spirituality and the Arts. She is an active guest curator, lecturer and writer.

Karen 'Iris' Lucas is a lifelong artist, loves reading novels and current event news, and listening to jazz and classical music, and watching foreign films or series (recently Bosch). As an artist, she worked as a custom carpet designer and later a secondary level visual art teacher, exploring a variety of visual art techniques, including some conceptual or socially conscious sculpture. (Cow With Palm Tree Growing Out Its Head, made of sculpted butter in reaction to palm oil being used in our Ontario butter.) Iris, her nickname, often includes a short narrative in her painted autobiographical series such as, *Woman With Flowers Coming Out Of Her Head or* more recently, *The River Nymphs*. Karen Iris moved from Toronto to Owen Sound in 2015 and lives with her husband John Schut beside the Sydenham River.

In October, in collaboration with Grey County, NWN launched Phase One of the "Transform the Lawn" project planned for the Grey County Administration Building on 9th Avenue East. Here is the Media Release: https://www.grey.ca/news/community-helps-grey-county-take-first-steps-naturalize-administration-building-site And, here is a tip for those just starting to think about how to 'transform' their own properties...Best advice is to leave fallen leaves (especially from sugar maples, birch and ash) on the ground between November and end of May. There's lots of research on how leaf cover is needed to provide a 'soft landing' and winter habitat for many, many creatures like bees and caterpillars in our (once) deciduous/coniferous forest land here. According to the Grey Bruce Climate Action plan, about 40% of our native insects are in 'steep decline' in this area. This has implications for food security. ~ from your friendly eco-worker, Shawna Macivor

This session, with an emphasis on women's issues, is aimed at examining on going issues with tribunals like the Landlord Tenant Board and the Human Right Commission. The speakers will also identify some possible remedial action.
